
PREP WORK

CLEAN SLATE

Ilways begin with a smooth and squeaky clean oundation. Like makeup, a flawless base creates a lawless finish. To achieve a flat surface, first sand walls ghtly. Then, scrub them down and wash away any esidue with a wet sponge soaked with mild detergent. or timeworn walls, remember to remove any loose lasters or adhesives and be prepared to repair defects rior to installation. This process may get messy, so it's est to lay dust sheets across your floors. On a side note, ve recommend roping in a reputable installer if you're lanning to paper more rooms.

100D MEASURES

Vhen it comes to installation, accuracy is crucial. Take lown the measurements of the entire length, width and eight of the room or wall, including the window and door penings. This helps you ascertain how many rolls of vallpaper you need to purchase. But mistakes are bound o happen, especially if you're new at this. To prepare for ny blunders, round up your measurements. Ordering a ouple more rolls of paper ensures you have extra to work ıith − just in case.





Get to know what you're dealing with before going shopping. Apart from patterns, wallpapers also come in a variety of forms. Vinyl coated paper, for example, withstands moisture well and is fitting for places like the kitchen and bath spaces.






UIDE LINES

Vallpapers come in a roll, and they're hung vertically ownwards. To ensure your paper - especially the first $\mathrm{pw}-\mathrm{is}$ perfectly straight, invest in a bubble level or a lumb bob. The former lets you ensure evenness for both orizontal and vertical lines, while the latter is only used s a vertical reference line. Mark out lines on your wall to uide you along as you paste your paper on.

TICK BY STRIPS

some types of wallpapers are pre-pasted, while others re sealed with adhesives. For those that need glue, first rush the adhesive onto the back of the paper thoroughly. et the moisture penetrate it, and then attach the strip on he wall carefully. With non-woven wallpapers, you need apply the glue directly on the wall instead of the paper. in doubt, check with the stores or the instructions efore you proceed.





Don't panic if air gets trapped in between wall and paper when you're installing your covering. It will usually vanish when the adhesive dries. If it doesn't, try to burst the bubble with a pin and gently flatten out the paper with a wallpaper sweep.
